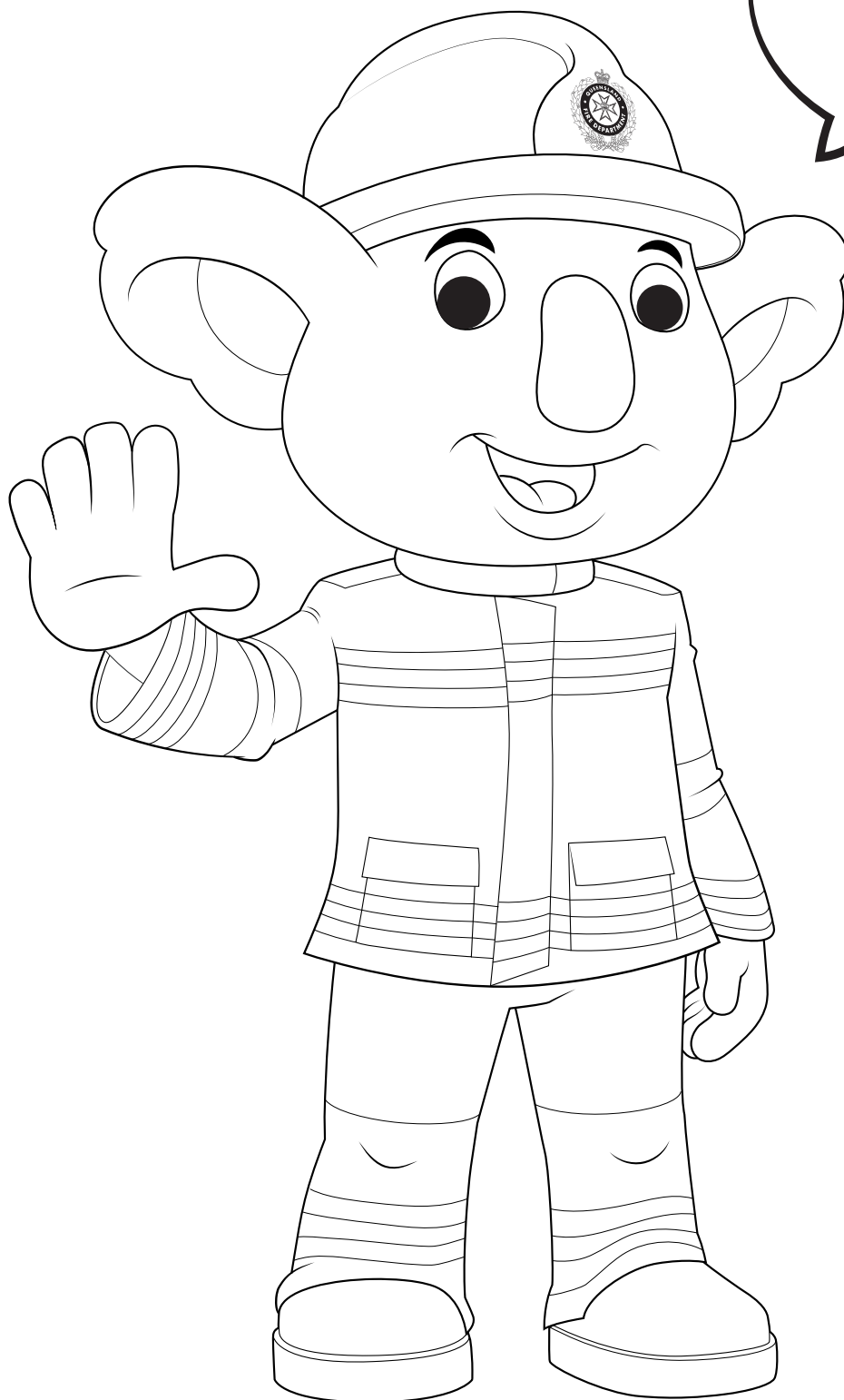




Hello!

Never go back into a burning building.



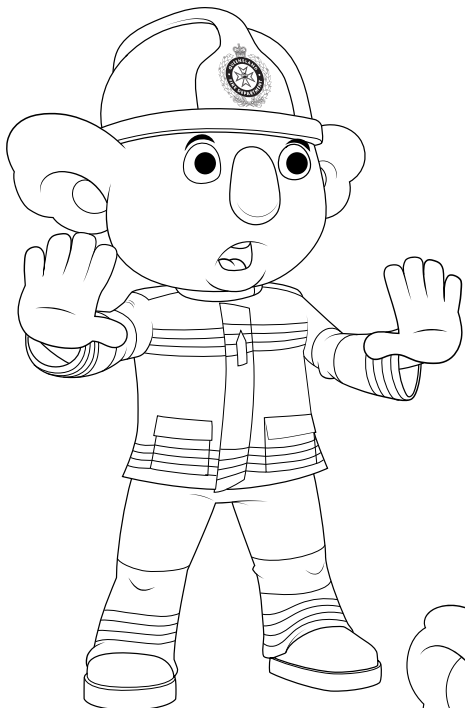
Test

They let you know if there is a fire.



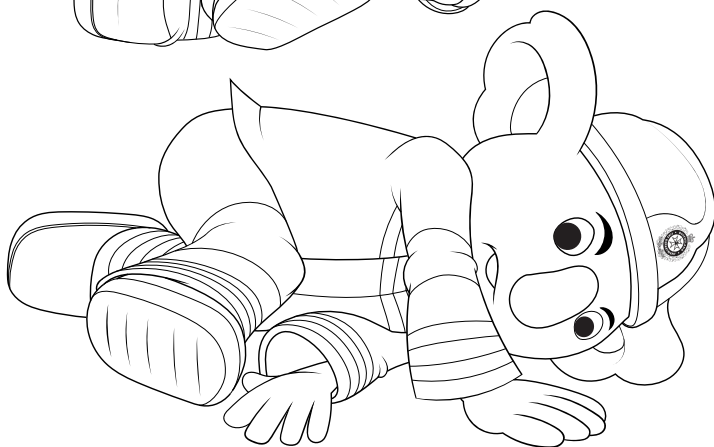
If your clothes catch fire, don't run.

ground.**

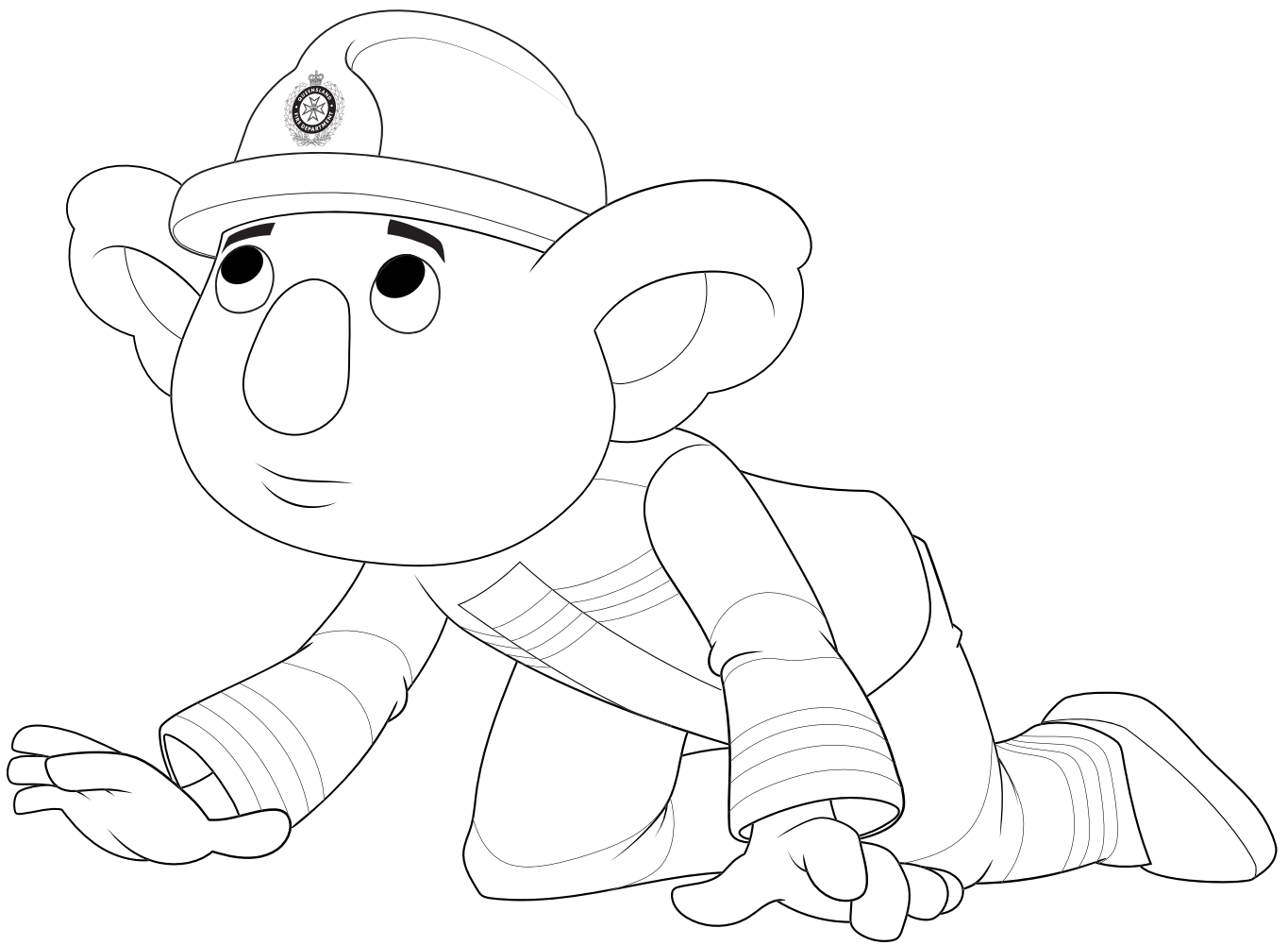


**Cover your face

**If there is a fire at home,
Blazer's meeting place is the mailbox.**

Pick a meeting place far away from the house.
Yours might be the bottom of the driveway.



**When there's smoke in the air,
get down low and go, go, go.**

Smoke makes it hard to see and breathe,
so Blazer crawls on the ground to get out.
Draw smoke above Blazer.



**If there's a fire, don't hide.
Shout!**

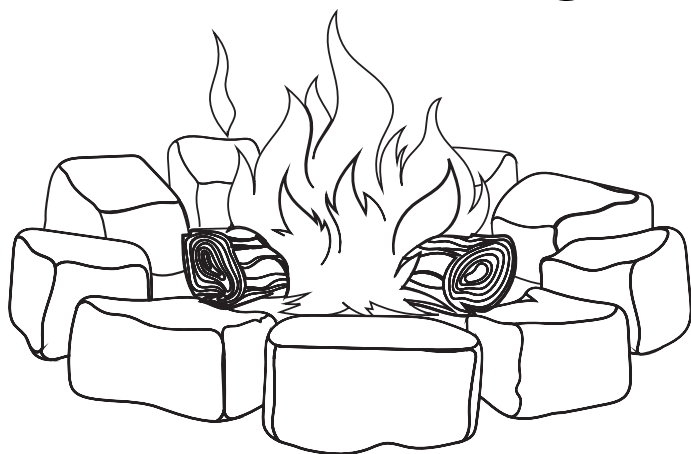
Bushy is a Rural Fire Service Queensland volunteer
